Elks literally overran Atlanta on the occasion of their grand annual parade, the closing event of their 1923 grand lodge convention and the reunion, and From tuition-individuals thousands of members of the order, with their two score bands, drum corps and other musical units, picturesque floats and handsome uniforms of purple and white received resounding ovations as they marched through the heart of the city.

Charles H. Grakelow of Philadelphia, esteemed grand esquire of the order. had charge of the marchers. Approxmately 8,000 persons were in line.

Prominent among the floats was the Pennsylvania state association exhibit, depicting the signing of the treaty with the Indians by Penn. The Philadelphia lodge No. 2, which has been conspicuous throughout the reunions with its large attendance and varied units, had three floats.

Headed by the local American Legion band, the first division included principally Atlanta lodge, 78 with nearly 4,000 men in line. They were followed by the second division, "headed by the Philadelphians, 600 strong, with their mounted patrol; automobile patrol, armed patrol and drift team.




