

ELECTION NOTICE.

Centre Hall Lyceum Course.
A second meeting of the guarantors was held in the council chamber on Tuesday evening, which resulted in the following action relative to the sale of tickets:
General admission season tickets will be of three grades, as follows: Children 8 to 15, exclusive, \$1.25; children 15 to 21, exclusive, if in school, \$2.00; if not in school, \$2.50; adults, \$2.50.
These tickets will soon be on sale by committees appointed by the president. The chart will be in the drug store and tickets can be registered and seats reserved there beginning Saturday, October 6th, at 7 P. M. The first there will be the first served. Change of Train Schedule.

Beginning Monday morning the train east over the Lewisburg branch made a slight change in its time of starting, leaving Centre Hall at 6:58 instead of 7:18 as heretofore. The bus will leave the postoffice under this schedule at 6:38 A. M.

Nursery at Huntingdon Reformatory.

There are now 1,987,000 trees in the nursery at Huntingdon Reformatory. More than 500,000 of these trees will be shipped this fall and next spring for planting in the forests of the state. In addition to these, 1,500 shade and ornamental trees will be shipped for planting on the grounds of state institutions.

The nursery was started in the spring of 1921. All the work is done by the boys of the institution. During the spring of 1923, 339,000 trees were shipped from the nursery and planted in all parts of the state.

According to figures compiled by J. W. Keller, Chief of the Bureau of Silviculture of the Department of Forests and Waters, the expenses of this nursery have amounted to \$6,628.34. He states that if the trees that have been shipped and are now in the nursery would be valued at commercial rates, they would be worth more than \$9,000. This shows that the two years of nursery work has resulted in a saving to the state of \$2,370 and at the same time has given delightful and healthful outdoor work to the boys at the Reformatory.

Conference of Women's Clubs.

The Centre County Conference of Women's Clubs will meet at Phillipsburg, on October 27. The sessions will be held in the Parish House of the Episcopal church at the corner of Fourth and Presqueisle streets. Reports followed by discussions will be a feature of the program.

The conference is highly favored in that Mrs. Olmstead, executive secretary of "The Women's International League for Peace and Freedom," will be the principal speaker.

D. 1923, a proposition will be submitted for the purpose of obtaining the assent of the electors of the School District to increase the indebtedness of said School District, Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000), to be used in erecting a new school building for the use of the Public Schools of said Borough and to carry out the building program recommended by the State authorities.

Notice is also hereby given that the amount of the last assessed valuation of the taxable property in the said Borough of Centre Hall as adjusted for 1923, is \$202,329.00. The present indebtedness of the said School District is as follows, to wit: None.

The proposed increase of debt is Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000), and the purpose for such increase is to obtain funds for erecting a new school building for the use of the Public Schools of said Borough, and to carry out the building program recommended by the State authorities.
