Dairyman League Case.

In a divided opinion handed down in Rochester, N. Y., the appellate division holds that the Dairyman's League Co-operative association, Inc., operating as distributing agent for milk poolers in this and three other states, was without power to force members to deliver milk at league stations.

The case, which originated in Oneida county, is being watched by milk producers in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Vermont. The disposition of about seventy-five suits pending under league contracts are affected by the decision, from which the league announces an appeal will be taken.

The league in this controversy is the organization that butted in on the farmers in this section and came near destroying the local plant operated by the Dewart people. They have been having much trouble in forcing farmers to deliver milk only to them.

Spring Mills Boy Elected Cross-Country Captain at Penn State.

The election of Biron E. Decker, of Spring Mills, as captain of the Penn State cross-country team for next year, was announced on Monday. He is a member of the junior class and has run on the team for two years.

THE NEW YEAR.

1924 is Leap Year—The Eleven Holidays Observed in Pennsylvania Fall on Week Days—Only One Friday, 13th.

Local merchants and firms are distributing calendars and almanacs for 1924. This year is Leap Year. It comes but once in four years and has long been designated as the season when sweethearts who have waited in vain for "their man" to ask the question, may pop it themselves.

New Year's day came on Tuesday. The last day of 1923 was Wednesday. None of the stated holidays fall on a Sunday. Armistice Day, which fell on Sunday last year, will come on Tuesday in 1924.

There will be only one "Friday, the 13th." That will be in June. That is a special jinx day to the superstitiously inclined. March, June, August and November, each have five Sundays.

Eleven legal holidays are observed in Pennsylvania. The are New Year's day, January 1; Lincoln's birthday, February 12; Washington's birthday, February 22; Good Friday, April 18; Memorial Day, May 30; Independence Day, July 4; Labor Day, September 1; Columbus Day, October 12; General Election, November 4; Thanksgiving, November 27, and Christmas, December 25.
