

SEASONABLE GOOD THINGS

PERHAPS some Inexperienced housewife may be helped by the recipe for Cranberry Sauce.

Take six cupfuls of cranberries, three cupfuls of granulated sugar, one-half cupful of water. Wash and pick over the berries and add the sugar and water, but do not stir. After they begin to boll, cook ten minutes closely covered. Remove the scum and when cool they will be jellied, the skins soft and tender.

Cranberry Punch.

Take one pint of cranberries, one and one-half quarts of water, one and one-half cupfuls of sugar, four oranges and two lemons. Cook the cranberries in the water and sugar until tender, strain and cool. When cold add the juice of the fruit and freeze until mushy.

Gluten Muffins

Take two cupfuls of gluten flour, two cupfuls of milk, two tenspoonfuls of baking powder, ode well-beaten egg; mix the dry ingredients; stir in the beaten eggs and milk. Beat thoroughly all together and half-fill buttered gem pans. Bake 20 minutes.

Fried Rice.

Take six cupfuls of cooked rice, one cupful of cold roast pork chopped, two tablespoonfuls of fat, one tablespoonful of salt, and two eggs. Add the salt, fat meat and cnion and let fry a few minutes. Add the rice, mix well and when hot add the eggs whole.




