





MAIN DISHES

Just before serving add one cupful of cooked spaghettl and one pint of stewed tomatoes. Serve on hot platter.

Baked Lima Beans and Tomatoes. Soak a pound of beans overnight, parboil for five minutes or longer to soften, rinse and cook until tender. Add one teaspoonful of salt to each quart of water used. Season a pint
