Fertilizer for the Garden-Manure The week-end preaching services held is the best garden fertilizer supple-150 to 200 pounds of manure per square rod spaded or plowed under plus eight pounds of acid phosphate broadcast and raked in is a good method of making your garden produce. If manure is scarce, use less and apply 10 to 12 pounds of a complete fertilizer such as 4-8-4 per square rod. Care of Horses' Feet-Roads that are frozen rough are extremely hard

on horses' feet. For heavy hauling, the feet should be protected by a good set of well-fitted shoes. Untrimmed hoofs break off. making the feet sore and the result is lameness. A rasp. a paring knife and a pair of pincers will do for ordinary hoof trimming.

Overheated Chimneys-The chimney ought to be examined at this time of the year. Overheated chimneys cause many of the too frequent fires in the country.
