**1800 Dimes Saved By Woman In Year**

Cedar Rapids, July 8.—A year ago one of the local national banks made an appeal to its depositors to save their dimes. It stressed the point that thousands of dimes were foolishly spent each year because a dime was such a small coin and seemingly valueless. It urged its depositors to make 90 cents do the work of every dollar and deposit the other dime in a savings account.

The idea "took." Scores of savings accounts were started and "thin" dimes became as popular as hard dollars. Now the bank is telling of the success of the plan. It points to one woman who has a savings account of \$180, all of which she saved in one year from dimes, money she originally would have spent and thought nothing about it nor considered herself any poorer.

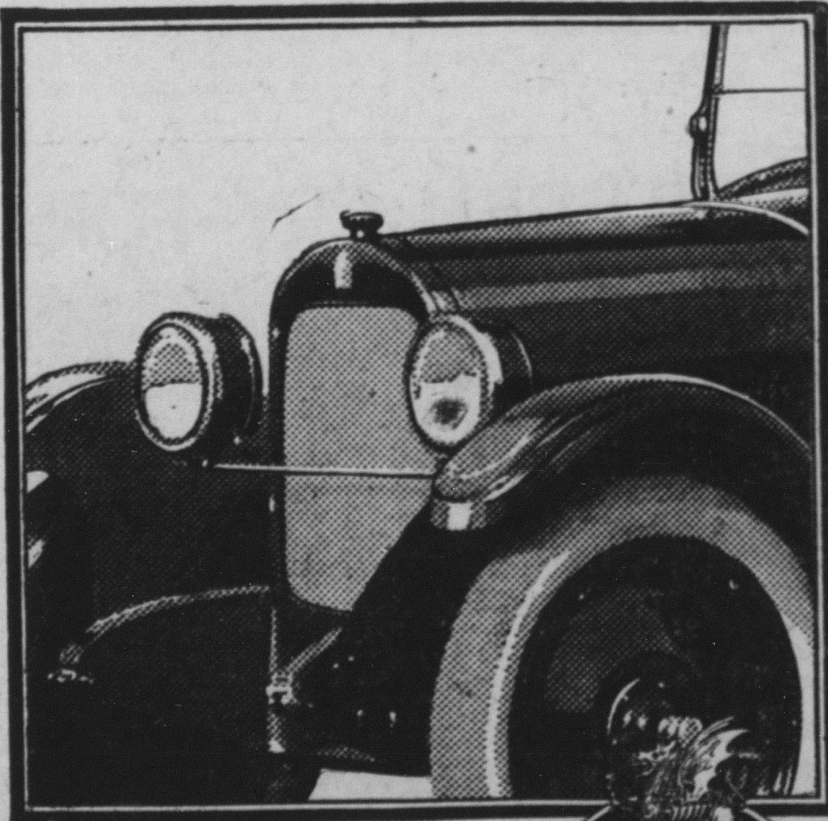

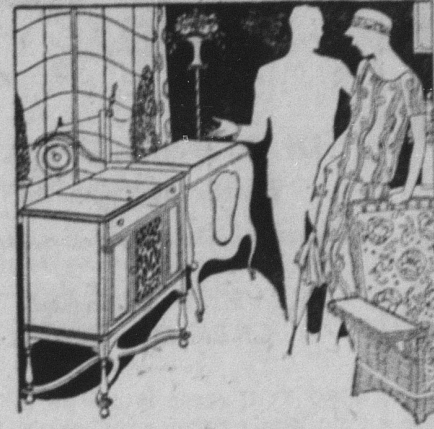
