**Dairy Cows Increasing.**

Centre county's dairy cow population is increasing, according to figures announced by the Blue Valley Creamery Institute. The statement covers an area embracing approximately one-eighth of the state in this section, and is believed to hold true for the county proper.  
A 2.8 per cent gain in the number of dairy cows two years old and over is noted for the district over the preceding year, while the increase for the state as a whole was 1.7 per cent as compared with 1923. The entire United States shows an increase amounting to 5 per cent, government figures show.

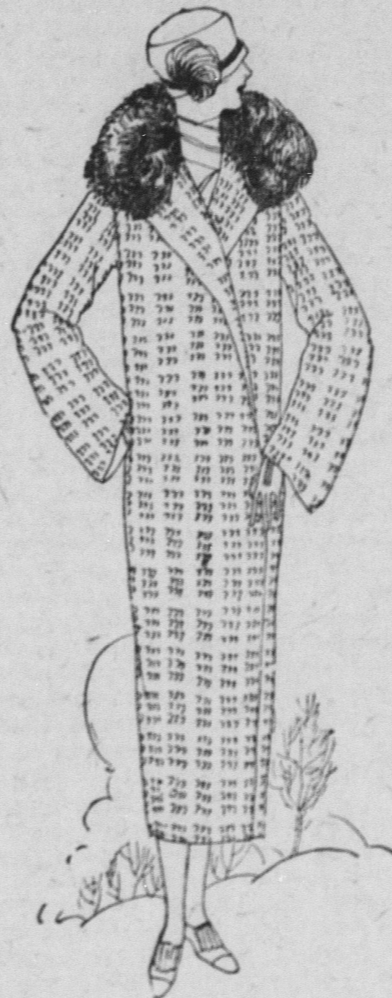
