PENNSYLVANIA STATE ITEMS

Stroudsburg.—Announcement was made of the sale of the East Stroudsburg Morning Press to the Moore Publishing Company, which issues the Stroudsburg Record and Times-Democrat.

Columbia.—Seeking revenge because he was discharged as night watchman at the plant of the Superior Pipe Company, William McClarin 50 years old, is alleged to have confessed to police that he set fire to the oil house of the company's property. He was committed to jail for court trial. McClarin is the second person arrested here in a month who has confessed to arson.

Blandburg.—Burglars dynamited the safe in the postoffice and stole money, stamps and registered mail.

Bloomsburg.—The Clark home on Market street has been sold to the Honeyawas Tribe of Red Men for \$20,000.

Hazleton.—Nellie Cleotola, aged 4, died at the State Hospital from burns received when her clothing ignited from a bonfire.

Reading.—Mrs. William T. Kantner, 68 years old, a widow, was stricken with apoplexy in St. Mark's Reformed church, and died before a physician could be obtained. She leaves two children, Mrs. Paaul Haas and Walter C. Kantner.

Locust Gap.—Mrs. Bridget Tracey, a school teacher, scratched a pimple on her face while attending institute in Sunbury, two weeks ago. The pimple became infected and poisoned her system, causing her death.

Mt. Carmel.—Harry Moyer has resigned as assistant postmaster to go on a farm near Bloomsburg.

Pittsburgh.—Said to be wanted in Pottsville on a forgery charge, Owen Boyle, of Covedale, was arrested here.

Bloomsburg.—Mr. and Mrs. John Ervin, of Catawissa, observed their 61st wedding anniversary with a dinner for relatives, and left later by automobile for Drexel Hill, where they spent some time with their grandson, Harold Ervin.

Sunbury.—Tension resulting from an outbreak of a peculiar malady in the rural districts east of the city, first thought to have been a form of the dread pneumonic plague, was relieved when it proved to be a combination of measles and bronchitis. The diagnosis was made by Dr. A. H. Smink, Shamokin, state expert, and Dr. Joseph K. Fisher, Northumberland county coroner.

Pottsville.—Ripe strawberries were picked at Cressona. Fully ripe tomatoes also are being picked. Many of these were left green in the fields for frost to destroy, but the sun has ripened them. The weather is not only the driest but also the warmest during any November in the history of this region following similar conditions in October. For the first time since the drought began the effect on streams supplying reservoirs is visible, water running into the reservoirs having decreased greatly the past few days.

Philadelphia.—A dynamite cap exploded while 9-year-old Joseph Maloney, of Bon Air, was playing with it in the back yard of his home, and blew off four fingers of his right hand. He was taken to the Misericordia Hospital, this city, for treatment. It is believed he found the cap in the back yard.

Pottsville.—William Dewitt, 17-year-old high school boy, of Port Carbon, who was acquitted here of the murder of his father, on the plea that he only intended to protect his mother, resumed his school studies at Port Carbon. He has been in jail seven weeks, and in order to make him feel at ease again a reception is being arranged for him. District Attorney Palmer says this case is fraught with much possibility of trouble, as it is feared the verdict freeing of Dewitt will give other youths cause to believe they may use deadly weapons on their parents without consequences of the law.

Mahanoy City.—To travel more than 200 miles by an automobile is the experience of Mary Whitenaltis, 101 years old, who left for the home of her daughter in Newark, N. J., to assist at the golden wedding celebration of one daughter and the silver anniversary of another. At the home of Mrs. Helen Idalkitis, aged 70, of Newark, will be held the golden wedding anniversary, with the silver anniversary of her sister, Mrs. J. M. Karlick, aged 44 years.

Lancaster.—Strong coffee cures hiccoughs, according to Mrs. J. F. Groff, who says its an old-time remedy. Several days ago Mrs. Groff's son was attacked by the malady, and she turned to an old book which recommended the coffee treatment. The coffee must be very strong, and may be taken with or without cream and sugar, she says.

Weatherly.—Council plans to float a \$15,000 bond issue to buy new fire equipment.

Pottsville.—The two Evangelical congregations decided to unite and build one big temple in the central part of the city.

Pottsville.—The Pottsville Construction Company won the race it has been having with Jack Frost and laid its last long stretches of concrete paving.

Johnstown.—Federal prohibition officers seized 125 barrels of beer, which they said were shipped from Wilkes-Barre.

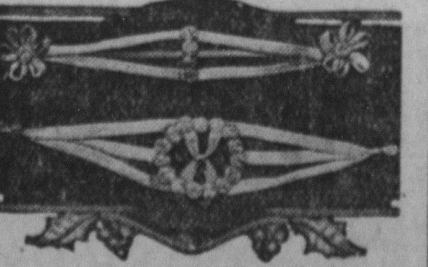

Snow an Effective Substitute for Ice

In some foreign countries, where natural difficulties have stimulated human inventiveness, it is quite usual for snow to be collected during the coldest part of the winter and buried well-pressed down in specially dug pits. So intensely cold do these blocks of compressed snow become under this treatment that after a few hours they freeze into solid lumps of ice, which keep almost indefinitely and can be dug up when required, says the Detroit News.

Especially in very hot countries these pits are frequently situated on mountains. Macedonia is one of the countries which adopted this method of insuring an adequate supply of ice during the summer. It is a remarkable fact that an ice supply laid down in this way at the beginning of the winter will last right up to the end of a summer consisting of many months of almost unbearable heat.

Bonus for Babies

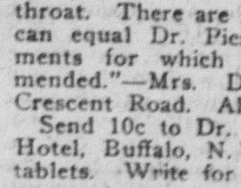
