**PRETTY SEAL ALSO SAVES MANY LIVES, SAYS DR. THOMAS**

The 1924 Christmas Seal is not only a beautiful decoration for letters and packages, but will mean health and life to thousands, according to Dr. John M. Thomas, Seal chairman for Pennsylvania. Dr. Thomas said:  
"The Christmas Seal for 1924 is the most artistic produced during the seventeen years in which the annual Seal Sale has become a recognized feature of the Christmas season. The Seal shows beautiful shades of red, blue and gold. The Seal is so artistic that it would sell readily for its decorative value. It has, however, a much greater appeal.  
"The Seal carries the words Health Christmas 1924. The double barred cross in red on a white shield symbolizes the world-wide movement for the prevention of tuberculosis, in which are enrolled the Pennsylvania Tuberculosis Society and its affiliated organizations. Through this campaign tens of thousands of lives have been saved in Pennsylvania since the Seal was first sold.  
"On this Seal also appears a woman clad in gold drapery, holding above her a torch which symbolizes knowledge enlightening the world regarding the dangers of tuberculosis, and renewing the hope brought to mankind through this movement—the message to the ill that tuberculosis can be cured, and to the well that it can be prevented.  
"The word 'Health' indicates the wide scope of the tuberculosis movement for the betterment of public health in all directions. This program is a broad one because it is now generally recognized that any sanitary measure or educational effort that improves general health conditions helps to prevent tuberculosis.
