



# SUFFERED AFTER TO INSURE PUBLIC **AGAINST AUTOS**

Compulsory Liability Insurance Bill Drafted.

BUDGET READY

Pinchot Will Submit Accommendation to the General Assembly-Pinchot Has 22 House Votes.

Harrisburg, Pa.-Compulsory liability insurance on all automobiles in Pennsylvania is provided in the tentative draft of a bill, for presentation in the present general assembly, by the joint commission appointed by the last legislature to recommend some methods of protection for the public against reckless motor car drivers.

The proposed measure has been agreed upon by the commission, after a number of public hearings and correspondence and conferencese with automobile clubs, insurance officials and others interested in the legisla-

The measure drafted is now being printed for public distribution. It is planned to be introduced by Senator Clarence J. Buckman, of Bucks county, chairman of the legislative commission, within the next few weeks, but It is understood that the members are willing to make any changes urged as desirable before the bill is called for final passage.

#### \$2500 For One Death.

The commission which drafted the bill includes, in addition to Senator Buckman, Senator William D. Mansfield, of Allegheny county, and Representatives Edward Haws, Philadelphia; Samuel J. McKim, Allegheny, and Charles F. Armstrong, Armstrong.

Enforcement of the proposed measure, which would take effect January 1 next, is provided by registration of all motor cars in Pennsylvania with the State Secretary of Highways. Registration is to be granted, however, only upon satisfying the Highway Department of the financial ability of the car owner to meet damages to the extent of \$2500 for one person infured or killed, of \$5000 for more than one person injured or killed, and for \$1000 additional for damages to property. In the registration of more than one car protection to the public is made mandatory to the extent of \$4000 for each motor vehicle, in addition to the rates for individual autos, with a maximum liability of \$20,000 for any His ten pure-bred Poland-China pigs number of motor vehicles thus li-

#### Budgeteers Silent on Report.

State budgetary and welfare officials decline to say whethere any percentage of increase had been agreed upon for apropriations to be recommended for the coming two years.

There have been reports current here the last few days that a 10 per cent advance had been decided on wing to some vigorus protests made by legislators as to the experience of institutions in their districts with what was allowed last time, but this could not be confirmed.

Neither could the report that people connected with a number of hospitals on the state list had been assured the deficits incurred in the operations of two years would be cared for.

About half the hospitals receiving state aid are declared to have used up their money.

Budget officials said the policy would not be announced until the governor thrifty and healthy; none of them himself told the legislature, but the report of advances especially where institutions demonstrated they could not make ends meet on what was allowed have been persistent.

The only thing on which the administration officials have been giving comfort is that the appropriations to be recommended will not be reductions from 1923.

#### Pinchot Has 22 House Votes.

Governor Pinchot can get some comfort out of the prevailing political situation. If the worst comes to the worst and the Grundy-Vare combination shows too much ruthlessness, the executive has a neat little block of votes than he can use in the legislature. This group does not consist of the 58 votes cast in the caucus for Goodnough. It is closer to 22, but at that, the number is not to be sneezed at. There could come a nemergency when they would hold a balance of power.

The governor has been mentioned as senator. He has had ambitions along that route for many years, but never got very far. A split up in the Republican party made him governor, thus advancing him, but he has not improved his chances in a senatorial

way during the last two years. Under ordinary conditions the Grundy-Vare deal can expect little from Governor Piachot. Vare deserted him because the wet interests demanded it. Grundy deserted him in the speakership fight. On the other side, the governor's attack on Andrew J. Mellon is not likely to be forgotten. Senator Pepper and Governor Pinchot are more friendly, but there is the barrier of organization that must seer them apart politically. The same with Baker. And as for Max Leslie, nis views on the governor are not voiced in whispers. The same feeling s held by many county leaders.

#### Rust on Cereals Cause of Damage

Two Varieties Found on Wheat Caused by Fungus Organisms.

There are several kinds of rust on tereals. Two of these rusts are most commonly found on wheat; namely, prange leaf rust and black stem rust. Both are caused by fungus organisms and the "seeds" by which they spread are called spores. These spores germinate, forming a germ tube which enters the living host plant and produces a spot which later breaks through the epidermis. This is called

Leaf rust has a widespread occurcence. Its pustules ofter are found on the leaves of wheat when the plants are young. They are of an orange yellow color, hence the name "orange leaf rust." The round spores can be recognized by means of a microscope. Though this rust causes some damage, it does not cause serious losses.

#### Rust on Stems and Leaves.

Stem rust is common on both stems and leaves. Its pustules can be told from those of the leaf rust by their reddish color and the torn paper-like edges of the pustules. The red spores of the summer stage are oval in shape.

The red or summer stage develops rapidly under favorable conditions, spreading the rust from field to field. The spores are so light that they may be carried long distances by the wind. Moisture does not cause rust but furnishes favorable conditions for the spores to germinate and multiply.

The common barberry, (Berberis vulgaris), is an important factor in the spread of stem rust. There are a few other species of barberry which may take stem rust and spread it to grains and grasses.

#### Barberry Starts Spread. An infected common barberry will start an early spread of stem rust. Several cases have been observed

where local epidemics have started from such sources. The Japanese barberry is harmless

and should be destroyed. Look out for early appearances of both leaf and stem rusts on grains and wild grasses. Send specimens and record of location of early stem rust on grain or wild grasses to the botany department of the State Agricultural college.-E. A. #### Winning Pig Litter Was

Given Run of Pasture The lucky farmer in the ton-litter contest of Indiana was W. F. Parks. tipped the scales at 2,774 pounds.

Here is how he fed the sow and pigs. The mother got corn, some inkage and a little skim milk, and the run of a mixed clover and timothy pasture, while she carried her litter.

After farrowing, a thin slop of bran and shorts was fed for three or four days. Corn was added on the fifth day and tankage when the pigs were a week old. Feed was gradually increased until the sows were getting a liberal feed by the time the pigs were two weeks old.

Pigs were started to eating on a slop of shorts and skim milk, and were fed by hand in a "creep." Corn was added a couple of weeks before weaning. After weaning the pigs were fed corn, shorts and skim milk and had the run of a clover pasture.

"The pigs did exceptionally well from the start," said Mr. Parks. "One big reason was because I kept the sows and their litters out of the old hog lots. The pigs were always were runted. It pays to keep young pigs where there is no danger of them becoming infected with parasites and

#### Work of Corn Borer

The corn stalk borer spends the winter in the tap root of the old corn stalk, where it is protected from winter weather. In the spring the adult moth or "miller" develops. Eggs are layed on the growing corn. Injury is caused by the larva or grub. This worm bores into the corn stalk, stunting the plant, and causing it to break down before the ears are mature. In some localities injury is severe.

While Soil Still Freezes The seeds of poppy, cornflower, cosmos, summer cypress, larkspur, snapdragon, snow-on-the-mountain and sweet alyssum may be sown on wellprepared ground just before winter for early spring germination, or on fall a possible candidate for United States | prepared ground very early in the spring while the soil still freezes at night, says the United States Department of Agriculture.

#### Cracked and Dirty Eggs

Cracked and dirty eggs are worth only a little more than half as much as clean fresh eggs with sound shells. Keep the nests filled with clean straw, sawdust, or hay, and avoid the loss from cracked eggs. By keeping the flock indoors in muddy weather, the number of dirty eggs can be reduced.

#### Bluestone Used for Sheep-Worm Control

Government Demonstration Attracts Many Sheepmen.

#### Sprouting Oats in Bags Is Most Practical Plan

This time of year when green food is dry and fibrous, sprouted oats is almost a necessity for laying stock. Two quarts of dry seed oats is sufficient for 100 hens. Place this in a thin muslin bag, made pillow-slip fashion and soak all night in a pail of water, tepid preferred. In the morning hang up behind kitchen range with drip pan below.

Each evening for five days, place a bag of the required amount of oats soaking; once daily dip in tepid water. shake and stir thoroughly to prevent heating. On the fifth day the first bag is ready to feed.

One good-sized pinch per hen is plenty. Sprouted or germinated oats should be fed in troughs or on clean boards as they are damp and collect dirt if fed in litter. Wash the bags in hot soapsuds and use over and over.

Sprouted oats is one of the finest of green feeds if fed sweet and clean. Never feed if moldy, sour or smutty. Do not overfeed; feed regularly each day. They help keep the birds in good condition and make hatching eggs more fertile and hatchable. Commence feeding to chicks when they are one month old, feeding a tiny bit at first and increasing each day.

#### Protein Feed Lacking

Few farmers who are raising poul try on a comparatively large scale have enough buttermilk or skim milk so that they can supply the protein needed in a ration made up of farmraised grains by feeding these products in the way mentioned. They must, therefore, have access to protein in other forms if they would secure profitable egg production, especially during the early fall and winter

#### Thinning Sweet Corn

Three stalks to the hill is a good average number of stalks when growing sweet corn. Some varieties will grow from three or four grains as many as a dozen stalks. The weaker ones should be pulled cut. Otherwise the yield will be reduced to small ears, or none at all. Three healthy stalks to the hill should average two to three ears to the stalk.

#### Sod in Orchards

Where the orchard has been in sod for several years the plowing should be shallow, so as not to tear up the small feeding roots which always come to the surface in sod orchards. Two years of clean cultivation will send the roots downward and there will be no danger of disturbing them. Afterwards the orchard should be kept in some kind of cover crop and in clean cultivation.
