YOUR INCOME TAX. The revenue act of 1924 provides to John Kelley, truct in Rush twp,; that the status of a taxpayer relative \$1,000. to the amount of his personal exemptions shall be determined by apportionment in accordance with the number of months the taxpayer was single. Penn twp.: \$580. married, or the head of a family. Under the preceding act the amount of Kee, tract in State College; \$1.200. the exemption to which the taxpayer was entitled was determined by his Henderson, tract in State College; status as a single person, a married \$450. person, or the head of a family on the last day of the taxable year, December 31, if the return was made on the calendar year basis, as most are.

For example, a taxpayer married on September 30, 1924, would be entitled tract in College twp.; \$275. to an exemption of \$1,375. For the first nine months he is classified as a single man entitling him to an exemption of \$750-three-fourths of the \$1,-000 exemption allowed a single person-and for the last three months he is entitled to an exemption of \$625one-fourth of the \$2,500 exemption allowed a married person.

If on June 30, a taxpayer ceased being the head of a family-the support twp.; \$1. in one-household of a relative or relatives being discontinued-he is allowed an exemption of \$1,750-one-half of the exemption of \$1,000 granted a single person plus one-half of the exemption of \$2,500 granted the head of a family. With regard to the \$400 credit for a dependent, the taxpayer's status is determined as of the last day \$6,944.53. of the taxable year. If, during the year, his support of such dependent ceased he is not entitled to this credit.

#### Dogs Chase Deer to Death.

Sunday morning two dogs chased a doe in Decker Valley, running it until it was so exhausted that it died. Paul Lingle, son of D. S. Lingle, saw the chase, and with a trusty rifle killed both the dogs neither of which wore a collar and could not be identified.

During last week dogs chased young doe from the mountains above Potters Mills, and on reaching the barn on the William Bower place, took refuge in it. It was thought the little animal had been injured, but when Game Warden Mosier looked it over on the following day, it was found to be abundantly able to care for itself and so it was liberated.
