State's Revision Commission Completes Report.

MANUFACTURES TAX THREAT

Upstate Members Talk of Measure to Support Pinchot Budget-Bill to Regulate Trains.

Harrisburg, Pa.-All crimes punishable by a maximum penalty of five or more years are made felonies, while offenses carrying a lesser sentence are classed as misdemeanors, under provisions of the new penal code prepared for submission to the legislature by the commission named to revise the code. The proposed act also adopts a definite relation between fine and imprisonment so that all crimes which are punichable with the same number of years of imprisonment will be punished by the same amount of fine.

In convictions of murder in the second degree the code adds a fine not exceeding \$10,000 to the penalty, while voluntary manslaughter is made a felony and the maximum fine increased from \$1000 to \$6000. It also abrogates the rule that in cases of homicide there shall be no conviction unless the victim dies within a year and a day of the act of commission of which caused death.

Penalties Made Equal.

In convictions for robbery the fine is increased from \$1000 to \$5000 and imprisonment from five to ten years, while the penalty for stealing is increased from five years' imprisonment and \$1000 fine to eight years' imprisonment and \$4000 fine. The code both increases and decreases penalties for certain offenses as well as adds a number of new sections. Among some of the other changes are:

Increase in the age limit for the sale of firearms from 16 to 21 years; decrease from five to one year's imprisonment for convictions for the habit of gambling; penalties for all crimes involving counterfelt money are made to conform to those provided by the federal statutes; willful burning of a motor vehicle is made a felony with a maximum penalty of 10 years imprisonment and \$5000 flue; the fine attached to conviction for arson is increased from \$4000 to \$10,-000, while treason is made punishable by life imprisonment. One of the new provisions provides a penalty of 12 years imprisonment and a \$6000 fine placing or throwing explosives under or at a building.

Representative Washington, of Cambria, introduced five bills relating to the operation of railroad trains. In one of the measures railroads would be required to have a flagman on all engines running without cars. Among the features of the other bills were: Prohibiting operations of a train more than a half mile in length; requiring railroads to maintain sidewalks between tracks on all bridges, and sanitary wash and sleeping rooms for employes and to keep locomotives in a safe and sanitary condition. Running of locomotives without automotic fire doors, power bell ringers and power shaker grates would be prohibited by one bill.

Among the shower of bills in the senate was a joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution for a literacy test for voters. It would become operative January 1, 1929, and would require every voter to be able "to read and write English."

Manufactures Tax Bill For House.

A bill for a tax on manufactures is to be introduced in the legislature. It will come from the Legislative League, composed of up-state members, largely friends of Governor Pinchot, organized to combat the Vare-Grundy-Leslie, Oliver alliance of city members opposing the governor.

Convinced the house will adopt Aud-Itor General Lewis' estimate of \$124,-000,000 available for appropriations for the next two years as against the Pinchot estimate of \$132,850,000, the League proposes to kill several birds with one stone. They plan to do away with the excess profits and gasoline taxes, raise enough money to cover the governor's budget and at the same time "punish" Joseph R. Grundy, president of the Pennsylvania Manufacturers' Association, and his friends by putting through a manufactures

The bill will propose a levy of five mills on each dollar of the capital stock of manufacturing corporations, which are exempted under the present capital stock tax. In the measure one-third of the tax will be allocated to public schools, one-third to hosiptals and the remainder to township roads,

A school tax to be levied on all persons more than 21 years of age in addition to all other taxes would be provided in a bill introduced by Senator Barr, of Allegheny. The bill, however, provides for a rebate of \$5 to all persons who vote at primary, municipal or general elections, the exemption coupon authorizing the rebate being given by the judge of each election board.

Senator Norton, of Berks, introduced a joint resolution providing for submission of a constitutional amendment authorizing a \$5,000,000 bond issue for equipping and erecting armorles for the national guard.

IS IT CRUGER?

RUGER has been so thoroughly naturalized as a surname in this country that it does not always occur to one that it is a name of German origin. The name is said to have orig inated in Germany from the Latin. meaning cross bearer, but it has generally been spelled Kruger rather than Cruger. Another authority, however. has it that this is simply a surname of occupation derived from the German word meaning innkeeper.

It is said that the family of the Barons von Cruger are distinguished from the untitled bearers of the name in their use of the initial C instead of K, and the fact that the American family has always spelled the name with the C is taken as one evidence of descent from the baronical family. Besides this there is a well-established and persistent tradition in the family, to this effect-and such traditions are well worth heeding.

The first of the name here and the founder of the family was John Cruger who came from Germany before 1700 and settled in New York city. He was a prominent merchant and man of wealth, and from all records was looked upon as a man of cultivation and position. He became mayor of New York, a position which was also held by his son, John Cruger.

The original John Cruger had four children: Maria, who married a Cuy ler; Henry, John and Tileman, Tileman died young, unmarried, and John, though he became mayor of New York and lived to make a fortune, as a merchant, and was first president of the New York chamber of commerce. never married either.

Henry, though he spent some time in Bristol, England, married in this country and is the ancestor of all the American Crugers. Peel and remove all white fiber from grapefruit, break the sections into small bits and add three tablespoonfuls of olive oil, one of vinegar and one of the grapefruit juice, salt and paprika to taste. Mix lightly not to crush; serve on the well-dried water cress.

Form the meat into small finger-sized rolls and incase each in the cornmeal paste. Wrap each tamale in corn busks and tie securely. 
