DESERTING THE FARM.

Farm Census Taken In January Re veals Shrinking of Farm Poulation and Property Value.

A heavy decrease of farm popula tion since 1920 has been revealed by the farm census taken in Januar; and February, according to unofficial reports from Washington, where the returns are being tabulated by the bureau of census. One statement says it is considered probable that es timates of a farm population loss of nearly a million during each of the past two years will be exceeded by the

In some counties the decline of farm population has been as high as forty per cent. although census offi cials do not believe that this figur pected however, that the decrease of 1920 will be somewhere betwee ten and twenty-five per cent.

Next to reduced farm population the most striking fact disclosed by enumerators has been a teriffic shrink age in the value of lands and buildings. In some counties for which complete tabulations are available this decrease is reported to run as high as twenty per cent.

While there has been some shrink age of acreage under cultivation, it will not, census officials say, keep pace with population declines. The conclusion is drawn from this that the individual farmer, with the aid of machinery, is accomplishing much more than did the farmers of a few years

The statistics gathered by the farm enumerators will be of considerable value in connection with legislative efforts to solve what is termed the ag ricultural problem, which never fails to be an interesting subject for congressional discussion.

In view of a recent statement by an official connected with the agricultural department at Waldnington that veals may be regarded by some as evidence that agricultural conditions are rapidly improving. Not all will take that view of it. however, and will continue to urge a back-to-thefarm movement




