TWO ELECTROCUTED AT ROCKVIEW ON MONDAY

Michael Bassi and Tony Pezzi, Cambria County Murderers During Payroll Robbery, Fay Penalty—Refused Attention of Chaplain.
Michael Bassi and Tony Pezzi, convicted of murder committed during a payroll robbery in Cambria county nearly a year ago, were electrocuted in the Rockview penitentiary on Monday. Bassi was taken to the chair at 7:02 a. m. and pronounced dead at 7:07. Pezzi was placed in the chair at 7:09 and pronounced dead at 7:15. Both men were game to the last, each refusing to make a statement in connection with the crime. They also refused the attention of the prison chaplain. Neither body was claimed and both were buried in the prison cemetery.
