Applying Disinfectant. The best method of applying the disinfectant is by means of a strong spray pump, although where the surface to be treated is limited a whitewash brush may be used. The pump should be equipped with not less than 15 feet of hose, there being attached to the hose a five-foot section of iron pipe of the same caliber with a spraying nozzle at one end.

Legumes Check Erosion

by Heavy Root System Legume crops may check soil erosion in three ways: (1) by furnishing a cover crop. (2) by the addition of a comparatively large amount of organic matter to the soil, and (3) by a heavy root system which tends to hold the soil, according to A. H. Karraker of the agronomy department, college of agriculture, University of Illinois.

Any legume may serve as a cover crop, but some legumes are especially adapted to forming a cover crop which will, to a large extent, prevent erosion on hill lands. Clovers such as red, alsike, mammoth, sweet and alfalfa make excellent cover crops. These cover and protect the land during the seasons when erosion is most likely to occur. These legumes are especially valuable in preventing sheet washing.

The above named legumes may be handled in such a way that they will add a large amount of organic matter to the soil and this in turn will help cut down the possibilities of erosion. The organic matter in the soil tends to absorb the water and in this way cuts down the volume of runoff. The organic matter also enriches the soil and reduces the hazard in growing cover crops,

Value of Liming in Improvement of Soil

Productivity Greatly Increased by Application.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.) The productivity of many soils can be greatly increased by the application of lime. I Lime acts various ways; it helps to break down organic matter, it corrects acidity, and it improves the physical condition of the soil. By hastening decomposition of the organic matter, lime helps to make such matter available as plant food for whatever crops may be grown. Lime should not be applied to soils deficient in organic matter, however, especially in warm humid climates, without taking steps to maintain or increase the supply of this essential ingredient, as otherwise the outcome will be a decline in yields. The best way to increase the amount of organic matter in the soil is to apply manure or turn under green crops, such as crimson clover, cowpeas, soy beans, red clover,

In the production of tomatoes crop rotation is advisable regardless of soil type or locality. By this means losses caused by insects and diseases are materially reduced. In an ideal rotation tomatoes will not follow tomatoes nor will there be included potatoes, peppers, or egg plant, because of the danger that the latter crops may transmit diseases affecting the tomato. In general, tomatoes should be grown in a rotation covering at least four years and including one cultivated crop in addition to the tomatoes and one or more soil-building crops.
