## Scientists Now Read Corn Plant

Secret Code Solved in Which Food Wants Are Very Plainly Written.

The corn plant writes an order for food when there is a shortage in the soil, and it writes in colors. G. N. Hoffer, pathologist of the United States Department of Agriculture, cooperating with the Purdue agricultural experiment station, has solved the secret code in which the food wants are written. His method can be used in the field and requires but a few minutes.

**Test Late in Season.**  
The test is made during the latter part of the growing season, after the ears are well developed. A stalk is cut and split open lengthwise. A solution of sulphuric acid containing a few drops of what the chemists call "diphenylamine" is applied to the cut surface of the stalk. If the plant has had sufficient nitrogen the tissues will turn blue. If the plant has been starved for this food the tissues will be of a yellow-green color.

A lack of potassium in the soil may be detected by examining the tissues at the nodes or joints of the stalk. If the tissues turn red when a solution of potassium thiocyanate is applied, the soil needs potassium. The amount of red color indicates the relative amount available.

**Need of Phosphates.**  
In soils found to be acid in reaction, underseeded or stunted plants indicate the need of phosphates, providing climatic conditions were normal during the season. On such soils both lime and phosphates can be profitably used.

Using these means of determining the needs of the corn plant, a field survey was conducted in several states of the corn belt last fall. According to the results many fields in southern Illinois, Indiana and Ohio, do not carry adequate supplies of available potassium for corn. Fields differed markedly in their relative supplies of nutrients, and in many cases the effects of growing corn continuously was shown by a deficiency of either nitrates or potassium.

The fact that the specific needs of the corn plant can be detected in this manner, says Mr. Hoffer, should make the method of great practical value.

## Difficulty in Getting a Stand of Red Clover

The increased difficulty in getting a stand of red clover, experienced in late years by growers in many sections of the country, is largely due to improper soil conditions, disease, nonadapted seed, wrong methods of seeding, or to the use of harmful nurse crops, says the United States Department of Agriculture. Improper soil conditions result from constant cultivation and the consequent loss of lime, phosphates, potash and organic matter, making the soil unsuited to the growth of clover.

Such conditions can be remedied by applying the elements lacking and by working in manure and other forms of organic matter. When clover failure is caused by disease, a disease-resistant variety should be used if available, or some other legume substituted for red clover. If red clover fails on land well supplied with lime, sweet clover can often be used instead.

## Best Care of Chicks

Don't allow the chicks to be out in the direct, hot rays of the sun all day. If they have no natural shade, provide some; it will pay well. Don't allow those chicks to brood in dirty quarters. Clean the coops often and at least once a week give them a good spraying with some good insecticide. It is much easier to keep the lice and mites down than to get rid of them, once they get a start. Don't neglect giving chicks some good, succulent green feed every day.

## Location for Trees

Trees are preferably located to one side of the house rather than directly in front of it. Groups of shrubs are placed about the foundation of the house and around the border of the lawn area. Lower shrubs are used about the house and taller ones in the border groups. Sod should not be allowed to encroach upon the shrub areas. The perennial beds and shrubbery groups should be cultivated three or four times during the season.

## FARM NOTES

The round worm is the little pig's worst enemy. Maneuver the pigs to fresh ground.

Milk pails and cans should be rinsed with cold water before the milk has a chance to dry on them, and then they should be washed thoroughly in boiling water.

The time has come for the landlord and tenant to begin working together—the stock-share-lease plan is advantageous to both.

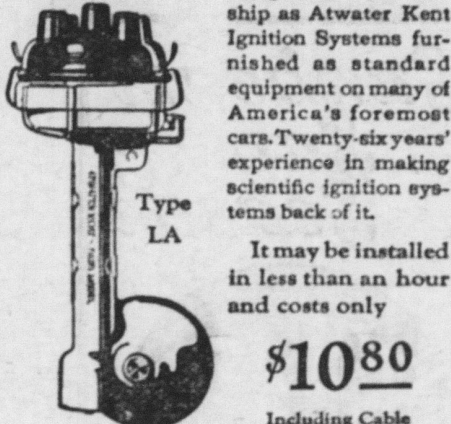

## Decapitation Adds to Insects' Lives

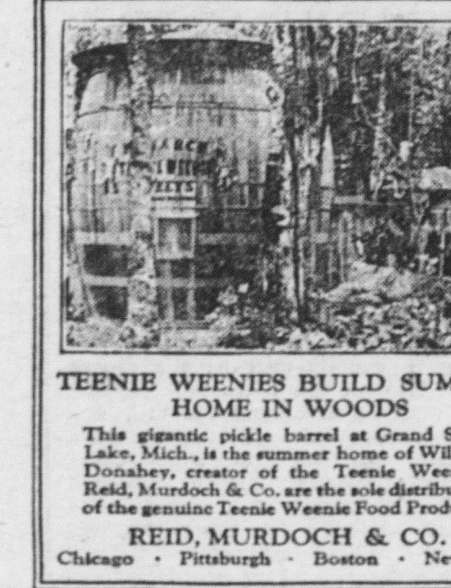

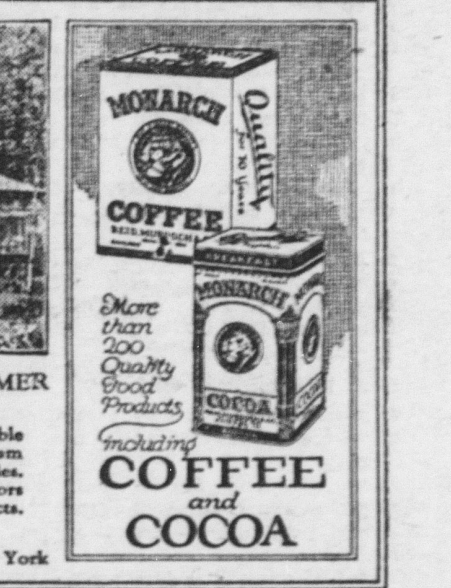
