**May Establish Training Camp.**  
What are probably the first steps  
toward establishing a large military  
training camp in the Scotia Barrens  
were completed last week when several  
land owners in the vicinity of Scotia  
and Wadde gave options on their land,  
pending final decision by the State,  
according to a statement by the Belle-  
fonte Republican.

For some years past officials in  
charge of the State training camp at  
Mount Gretna have been handicapped  
by lack of space to carry out military  
maneuvers properly. The need for a  
much larger training ground has long  
been felt, and so far the Barrens have  
been looked on with great favor by of-  
ficials who last week inspected the ter-  
ritory as guests of Col. T. D. Boal, of  
Boalsburg.

While nothing definite on the propo-  
sition has been done as yet, Col. Boal  
states that he expects definite results  
within the next month. A rifle range  
is being constructed in the neighbor-  
hood of Benore.

**College Bus Wrecked.**  
"Miss Nittany," the crack State Col-  
lege auto bus, was partially wrecked  
near Bloomsburg, on Saturday, by  
crashing broadside into an embank-  
ment. The bus was on its way to  
Scranton with thirty-one college stu-  
dents.

The rear end of the bus was torn  
out by the crash, dumping the rear  
seat passengers on the road. Miss  
Frances Gager, Scranton, and two  
young men needed medical attention  
for lacerations.  
The bus returned home the same  
day under its own power.

**Shot 29 Doe Deer.**  
A party of hunters from Centre Hall  
and surrounding country who made  
their headquarters at the Bradford  
hunting camp at Pole Bridge, killed  
twenty-nine does in Huntingdon coun-  
ty. The camp is located close to the  
section then open for killing does.  
Four of the "does" were bucks with-  
out horns. Two were young bucks  
with nothing but "buttons," one had  
his horns entirely broken off, and a  
third had shed his antlers in the nat-  
ural way. This would indicate that a  
large number of bucks were killed for  
does for which hunters could not be  
held liable.
