Millin County Road Program.
The road between Lewistown and Reedsville and on to Bellefonte—sur- veys are being made for ultimate right-of-way plans. No construction work is contemplated except the grade crossing elimination at Mann's Nar- rows, which should be completed some time during the coming construction season.
From Lewistown to McClure, Snyder county, construction work is now being done on a stretch of 4.7 miles from Shindie to the Snyder county line, with bituminous surface treated Macadam.
Between McVeytown and Mount Union, the work under contract should be completed by May 1st. The sur- facing will be done by the State.
A section of State aid road is under construction between Burnham and Vera.


