Service of Architect of First Importance

Most persons suppose that the plan of a small home is simply the result of following a few "rules of thumb," and that by a few trials and shufflings of mere spaces for rooms, with walls on four sides, and some kind of a cheap roof, a house can be compiled. The sorry truth is that many so-called houses emerge from this method, but certainly no correct solution of a home builder's problem is thus achieved.


Each room must have its appropriate size, shape, aspect and relation to other parts of the house. Proper relation of rooms means no waste of time to the occupants when going from one part of the house to another. A saving in steps is a real comfort to the busy housewife. All parts of the house must be properly lighted with sufficient window area, and doors must be properly placed so as to leave sultable spaces for furniture. An architect never studies plans for a home without placing properly the necessary pieces of furniture, and being sure that there is room enough for them.

Now, all this may seem simple enough, and it is, were not the inevitable factor of cost ever present to determine the limit of what can be done. This most important item can be controlled most properly by the architect who makes complete preliminary drawings for his client and obtains preliminary bids before final construction is begun. The plans made by an architect, complete in detail, show the contractor exactly what is expected of him. The architect eliminates "the extras" so often incurred by the unenlightened using poor plans or possibly no plans at all except "their builder's" sketches.

One-Story Factories

Where choice is unhampered, as by lack of ground space, the trend is strongly toward the one-story building for general factory purposes. Comparison of typical structures of each class shows much additional expense and waste room incidental to stairways, elevators and approaches in the multi-story building. Walls and columns also take up a greater part of the inclosed space, and for a total floor area of 72,000 square feet in a representative six-story building there is a non-productive floor area of 13,368 square feet, as against only 4,428 square feet in the one-story structure. The cost of additional roof construction for one-story buildings is offset

by the lower cost of floors which are laid directly on the ground in the single-story factory. Cost of land is a minor item as compared to that of the building.

Planting First Garden


Scheme Devised to End

Peril of Motor Fumes A recent experiment in the city iaboratories of Paris is said to have demonstrated the practicability of a catalyzer designed to consume the carbon-monoxide gas produced by motor cars-which Prof. Yandell Henderson of Yale and others have asserted was a serious menace to public health in crowded citles.

176.45 miles an hour. It is hard to The device consists of an exhaust pipe containing certain chemicals possessing catalyzing properties which reduce the combustion temperature of the noxious gas. By the passage of a current of air through the tubes the fumes are consumed before they can pass out into the street.

M. Kohn Abrest, director of the laboratories, says that the average motor car in Paris gives off one-half cubic meter of carbon-monoxide for each half gallon of gasoline burned and that a cubic meter of such gas renders six cubic meters of air unfit to breathe. In the country the half cubic meter of gas is scattered along half a dozen miles and consequently is harmless, he says, while in Paris the automobiles move more slowly and often fill the air of narrow streets habit and look for the parts.

Cannibal Butterflies


