

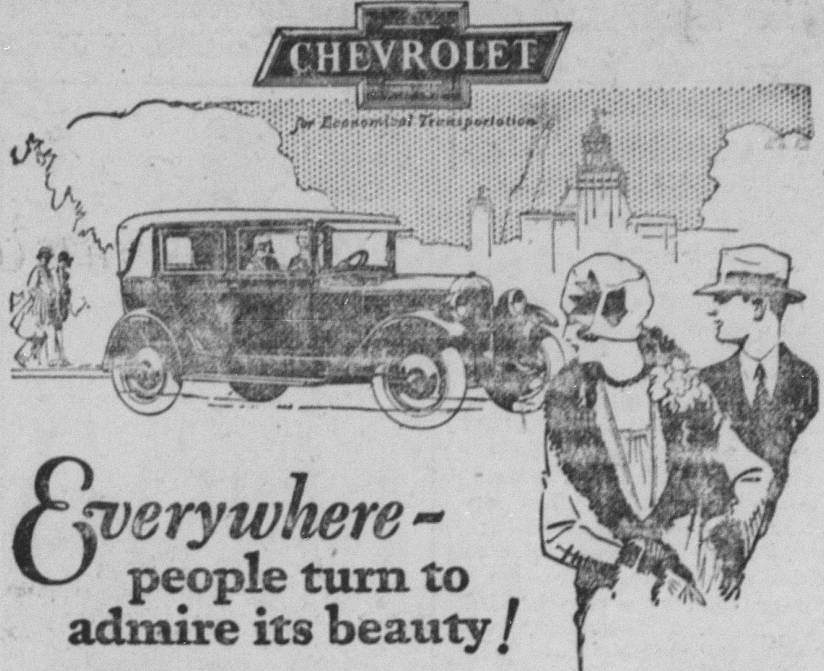
Celebrates 8th Birthday.
