Tossed Away Fortune in Playful Scuffling

To have a book worth considerably more than a thousand pounds thrown at one's head is an experience which does not fall to the lot of many. It happened, however, to Dr. Adolf Ehrenfelt.

It has just been announced that the Hungarian National museum has acquired this book by private treaty. Although it was on Sotheby's catalogue at a reserve price of £1,000, it is stated that the price actually paid is much in excess of that sum.

The book is the first printed in the Magyar tongue, and is known to col-lectors as the Codex Ehrenfelt. It contains 81 pages and dates from the year 1430.

Its former owner, Doctor Ehrenfelt, a Viennese lawyer, came into possession of the book in an unusual way. In 1851 he was a student at Nyltra, in what was then northern Hungary. One day, while he was wrestling with a companion, this book was hurled playfully at his head and he pocketed it. It was only many years later that he rediscovered it, examined it, and became aware of its unique character and great value.- London Tit-Bits.
