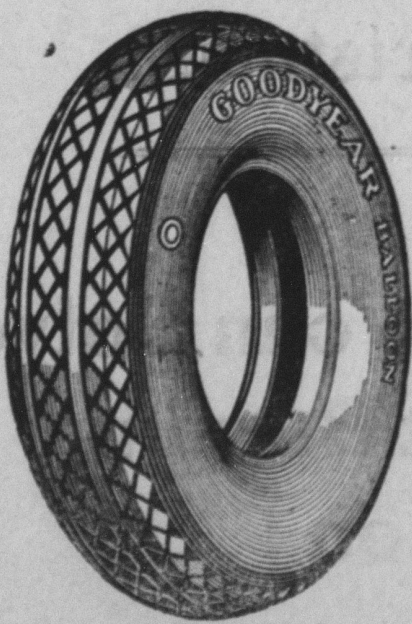

CLINICS AID MANY PERSONS IN STATE

One of the important pieces of work made possible through the sale of Christmas Seals by the Pennsylvania Tuberculosis Society and its affiliated organizations throughout Pennsylvania is the medical service.

This service includes clinics, which give health examinations, and medi-

cal lectures and demonstrations before medical societies, nurses and other groups. In the clinics emphasis is laid on chest examinations. The clinics are conducted by the medical director of the Pennsylvania Tuberculosis Society in co-operation with physicians in the communities where they are held.

In the first ten months of 1927 these clinics showed the following records:
88 clinics held.

11,077 diseases and defects discovered.
273 persons, or 7.2-10 per cent, were found with indications of tuberculosis.

According to Dr. W. P. Brown, medical director of the Pennsylvania Tuberculosis Society, there has already been reported a large number of corrections and early treatment of diseases as a result of the clinics.

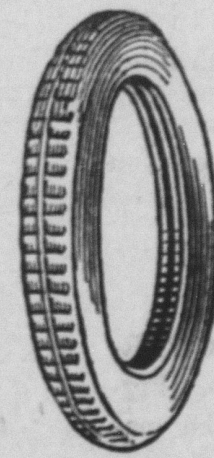
TUBERCULOSIS DAY
