PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE BUREAU OF ANIMAL INDUSTRY

GENERAL QUARANTINE ON CATTLE

It has been determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture that Tuberculosis, known and proclaimed by said Department as a disease of transmissible character, exists in cattle in the Township of HARRIS, in the County of CENTRE, Pennsylvania.

Therefore, under the authority of the Acts of July 22, 1913 and June 7, 1923, the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has adopted and will enforce a General Quarantine on cattle in the above described quarantined area.

Regulation 1. No cattle shall be imported or brought in, or allowed to enter the quarantined area, except in accordance with the following rules:

(a) Range cattle may enter the quarantined area, except from a herd confined within or without such quarantined area when the last previous test of said herd under the Accredited Herd Plan showed no tuberculous reaction.

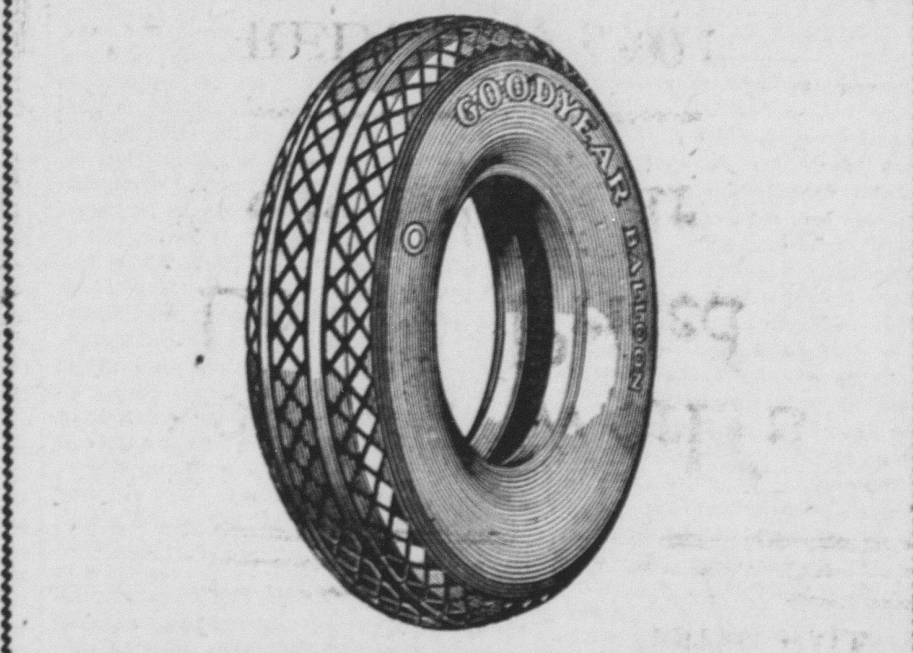
