FARM CALENDAR.

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State College.

USE CELLAR FOR STORAGE—The house cellar is a convenient place for vegetable storage. A dirt floor is preferable. The furnace cellar should be separated from the storage cellar by a concrete wall or a double wood partition. A window is needed for ventilation. An outside pit, made by bury-

ing a barrel horizontally in the side of a bank, makes an ideal place for storing cabbage and root crops, and the unused lothed pit frequently can be used successfully for storing celery.

PICK BREEDING BIRDS—The 1928 breeders should be selected now, say State College poultry specialists. Keep only those birds for breeders, that have pale shanks and beaks, are still laying, and have not moulted up to the present time. These birds should be up to breed weight, true to breed type, and free from disqualifications as described by the American Standard of Perfection.

MAKE USE OF LEAVES—Leaves make a good mulch and protection to rose bushes and shrubs from damage by frost.

SAVE HEAVY SPRING WORK—If manure is handled out and spread daily during the winter months it saves double work in the spring.

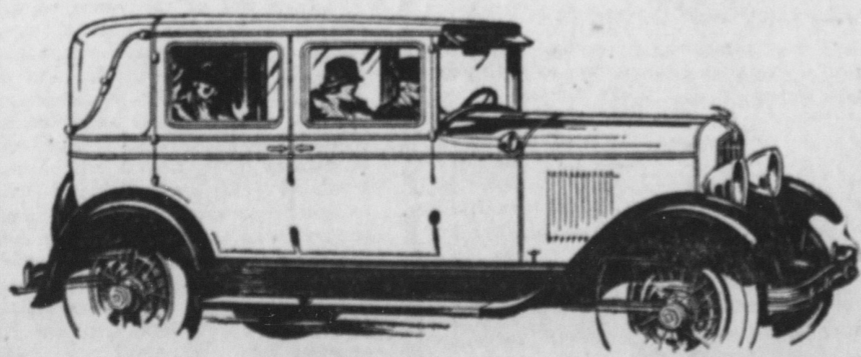
