

**FRANK M. CRAWFORD TO QUIT POTTER-HOY COMPANY**

**Resignation Becomes Effective January 1—No Future Plans—Has Been With Firm 28 Years.**

After twenty-eight and a half years of service during which time he filled the positions of salesman, purchasing agent, director and treasurer, Frank M. Crawford, of Bellefonte, one of the most active and prominent business men of the county, will sever his relations with the Potter-Hoy Hardware Co. on January 1, 1929, according to an announcement from that store.

Mr. Crawford's resignation was tendered to the Company last month and was reluctantly accepted.

Back in 1885 Mr. Crawford took his first job as a clerk in a general store at Laurenton, subsequently coming to Centre Hall where he engaged in the general mercantile business for eight years as the junior member in the mercantile firm of Wolf & Crawford. Following that, he went to Bellefonte to become a salesman for the Potter-Hoy Hardware Co. and traveled over Centre county in a buggy.

He rose from salesman to purchasing agent, then to treasurer and in the meantime became a member of the Board of Directors. During these years of administrative work he was never too busy to assume the role of salesman, laborer or to do what he saw necessary to do in the store.

Coincident with his rise in the executive rank of his firm, he also enjoyed an enviable popularity among his townsmen where his worth was recognized and appreciation shown by his appointment to the following posts: Member of the Lutheran church council; Charter member of Kiwanis; vice president of Kiwanis for one and one-half years; director of Kiwanis; president Board of Directors of the Y. M. C. A.; president of the Centre Oil and Gas Co.

Mr. Crawford was always helpful in securing sites for new industries in Bellefonte and interesting his fellow townsmen in support of such projects. Just at the present time he is rendering much valuable assistance in securing a new site and a new military post for this community to take the place of the present inadequate armory.

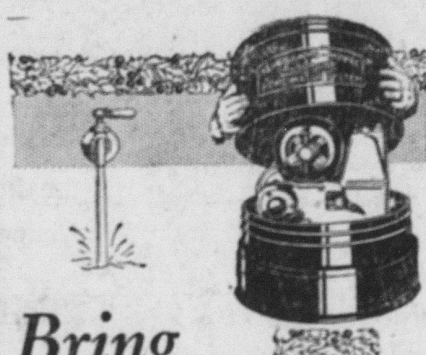
