## FRANK M. CRAWFORD TO QUIT POTTER-HOY COMPANY

Resignation Becomes Effective January 1-No Future Plans-Has Been With Firm 28 Years.

After twenty-eight and a half years of service during which time he filled the positions of salesman, purchasing agent, director and treasurer, Frank M. Crawford, of Bellefonte, one of the most active and prominent business men of the county, will sever his relations with the Potter-Hoy Hardware Co. on January 1, 1929, according to an announcement from that store. Mr. Crawford's esignation was ten-
