Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State College.

PROTECT TREES FROM MICE-Mice girdle enough fruit trees in the United States to cause an annual loss of about \$6,000,000. Why not put some polsoned grain in your orchard to destroy these pests and prevent your share of this loss? This is a good time to put out the balt.

CONTROL CORN BORERS-Cutting orn low helps to control the European orn borer. Ensiling and shredding are perations employed to destroy the insect. Cleaning up all trash is a nec sary practice and it should be burned, buried, or plowed under cleanly in the field. Insects permitted to live will multiply by the hundreds next year. ORDER, FOREST TREES NOWpeaking of the thousands of forest trees planted last spring, forestry specfalists of the Pennsylvania State College call attention to the absolute neessity of ordering trees early for planting next spring. Your county agent can help you decide what type of trees are suitable for your conditions. He can also get you an application blank for trees to be ordered from the State Department of Forests and
