KEEP APPLES COOL—Apples keep best in a cool, moist, well-ventilated storage.

ORDER CHICKS CAREFULLY—Before placing orders for chicks consider the size of egg, shell texture, and freedom from taint of eggs produced by the stock from which the chicks were hatched.

BLOOD TELLS IN DAIRYING—Cows are good or poor producers according to their blood inheritance.

GROW PLANTS IN HOUSES—Sash greenhouses are being substituted more and more for the old-fashioned hotbed in growing early plants.
