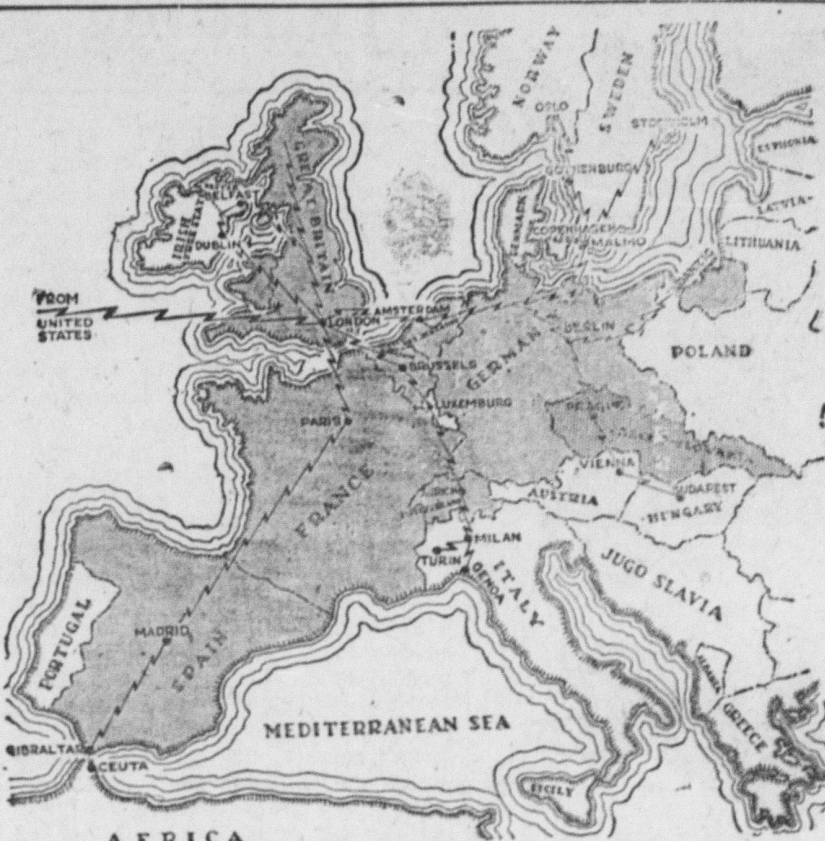
BOALSBURG ITEMS.
