MUST APPLY FOR NEW PENSIONS

Local World War veterans entitled to benefits of the new pension bill which went into effect last week must file application if they want disability allowance, according to word that has been received from District Himes of the veterans' bureau. The bureau has prepared a form for these applications which when filled out may be sent directly to the veterans' bureau or forwarded through veterans' organizations. An impression current that veterans who previously had applied for compensation and had been turned down might consider the earlier application sufficient. This it is pointed out, is not the case and compensation granted will date from the day of the newer application.

BELL TELEPHONE CO'S NEW METHOD PROTECTS PATRONS

A new method of identifying those of its employees whose duties necessitate their entering homes and business establishments has been inaugurated by the Bell Telephone company. The company has issued to each employee whose work brings him in contact with the public a card bearing his photograph, typewritten name and signatures. The cards resemble the familiar metal, bell-shaped badge which installers, repairmen and others in the company's service had worn for many years. In addition to the employee's photograph, name and signature, each of the new identification cards bears the signature of the head of the department with which the employee is associated. While the photograph on the card serves to establish the identity of the bearer in homes and commercial establishments, the additional check of having the possessor of the card furnish his signature also can be made, if believed desirable. The old bell-shaped badges have been gathered up and destroyed by the telephone company.
