Fix Values of Claims of Owners Along AMONG THE LEADING PUBLIC SALES. Bellefonte-Milesburg Road, and **STYLE SHOW** Along Potters Mills-Tusseyville Road. The Centre County Board of Road Viewers has awarded damages in five Public Dung Dund & High Anada Cattle STARTING petitions involving property located along the recently improved highway

between Bellefonte and Milesburg, as well as in a case along the proposed new highway near Potters Mills, following hearings recently.

In one petition, it is undertood that John McCoy, of Bellefonte, sought damages aggregating \$13,000 from the county, but the viewers concluded that \$50 covered the damagge to Mr. Mc-Coy's property.

Other property owners along this stretch of road were rewarded as follows: Carrie Barnhart, \$700; John H. Wilson and wife, \$850; Mrs. John H. Barnhart and children, \$950; William A. Thomas, \$2,000.

The viewers also awarded Mrs. Geo. H. Emerick, of Potter township, \$1400 for damages to her property by the building of the road between Potters Mills and State College.

A hearing was also heard in the case of Annie Zelesnick, of Pleasant Gap, vs. the school district of Spring township, in which the viewers awarded \$450.00.

According to J. Kennedy Johnston, chairman of the Board, each of the above petitioners as well as the county commissioners, have the right to take an appeal within thirty days when the merits of the case will be aired before a jury.

Cows Need Much Water-

Dairy cows should have all the water they need to drink and have it when they want it. Drinking cups in the stable make this possible. Their cost often is repaid in a single season through increased milk production.

Plant Ornamentals Right-

In planting trees and shrubs, place top soil and sub-soil in separate piles. When filling in, apply the top soil about the roots and add commercial fertilizer or well-rotted manure if necessary.





