The cleada or harvest fly is not a locust at all, the true locust being a grasshopper. The periodical cicada or 17-year locust is a large insect about an inch and a half long with wide blunt head and with prominent eyes on the outer angles. It is black, banded and marked with some orange on the abdomen, and it has six reddish legs. It has four shiny transparent wings with network of orange colored veins. Its life cycle is about 17 years, most of which is spent as a larva or pupa underground. The locust has long hind legs with thickened thighs and narrow leathery wing covers.
