IT'S ALL IN THE BLEND, SAY THE EXPERT TASTERS

Not long ago eight expert coffee tasters tested forty-eight unidentified commercial brands of coffee in New York city. So expert were these tasters and so unmistakable were the different blends that one brand was chosen "first" by each taster.

The best cup of coffee comes from an ideal blending of two or more types. Coffees from the lower altitudes are usually of an inferior quality and epicures demand that it be blended with coffees from the higher altitudes, which have finer aroma and are richer in flavor.

"The best coffee that is in abundant supply is probably Medellin coffee, shipped from the Colombian city by that name," says the Journal of the New York Botanical Garden. Colombian coffees, because they are grown in high altitudes, are noted throughout the world for their richness of flavor and aroma.

PERUVIANS MAY FORCE COLOMBIA TO ARMS

Eight million Colombians are viewing with alarm the threat of Peru in occupying the Colombian town of Leticia, which action may cause the ending of 30 years of peace. The citizens of this South American "model nation" regard most highly their reputation as a peaceful people.

The Republic of Colombia was founded in 1819 with practically the same form of government adopted earlier by the United States. Since that date only minor disturbances have upset the even tenor of Colombian life but none of these have occurred during the present century.
