Good Hens Make Profits—

Records kept on poultry flocks reveal that high egg production per hen is necessary to make profits.

Exhibit Dairy Cattle

Keep Ewes in Condition—

Breeding ewes need some form of succulence, such as corn silage, plenty of water, and sufficient exercise if they are to keep in the best condition.

Protect Evergreens—
