Historical Facts

[Under this head will appear one or more historical facts of local interest, to a large extent taken from Linn's History of Centre and Clinton counties, designated for reference as L. H., the figures following indicating page. The "Notes," if any, are those of the editor.]

The first Presbyterian church in what is now Gregg township was organized before 1789, erected on the Mueser place, north of Penn Hall.

The Methodists in Gregg township at first worshipped in the school house that stood between Spring Mills and Penn Hall.

(Note: The "hill" referred to is at the Allison home, west of Spring Mills. The original structure built by the Presbyterians and Methodists was later transformed into a dwelling house by casing it with brick.
