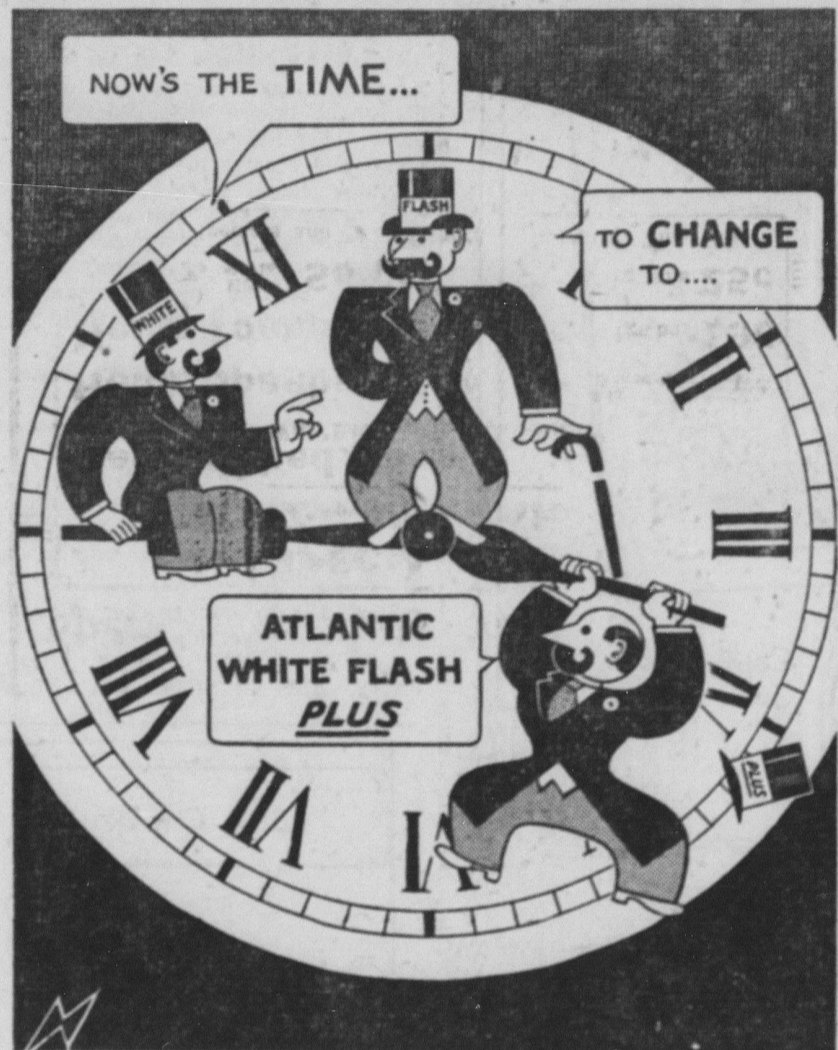
The 4H Club girls will hold a bake sale on the school grounds at Spring Mills on Saturday evening, August 17. Everyone welcome.
