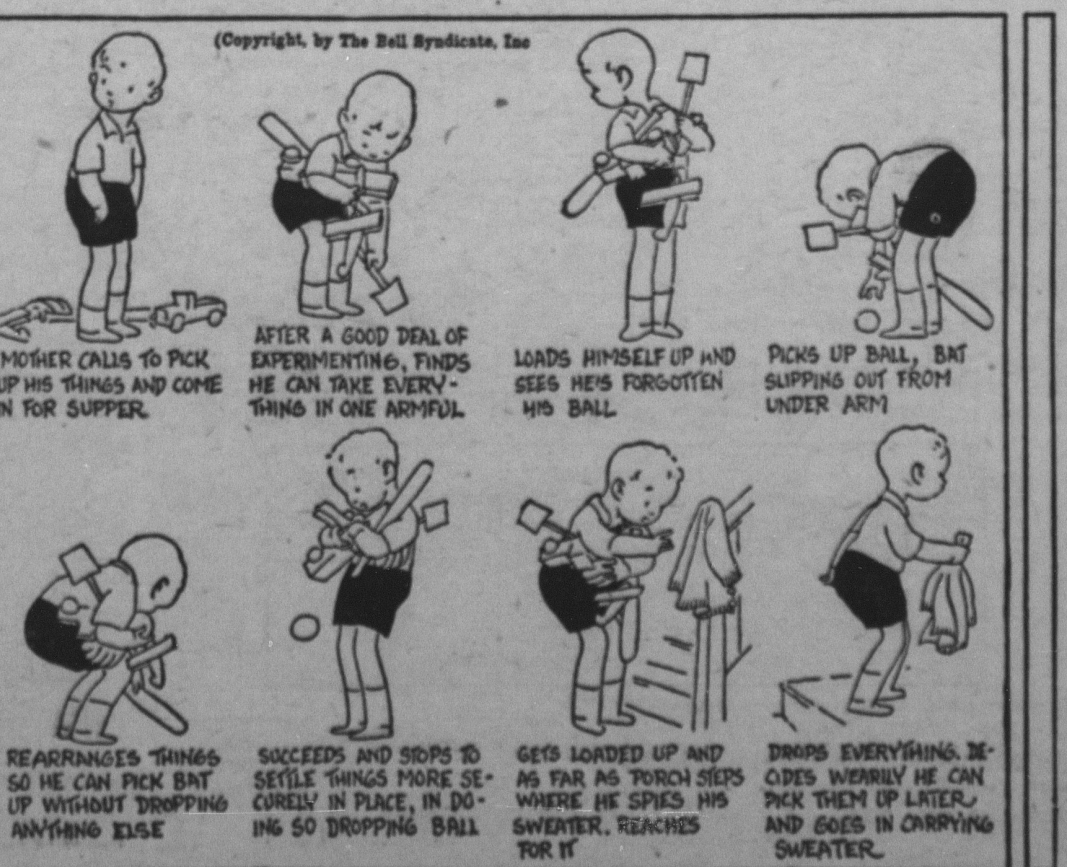

REARRANGES THINGS SO HE CAN PICK UP WITHOUT DROPPING ANYTHING ELSE

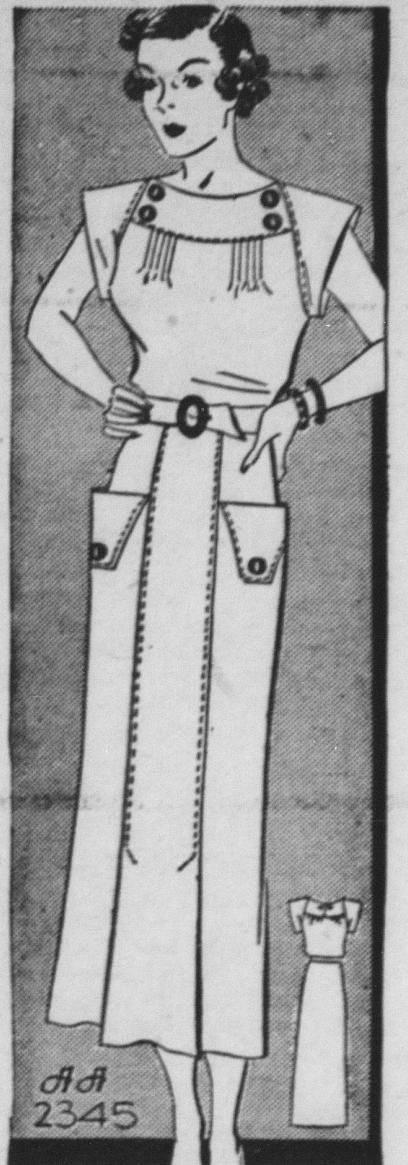
SUCCEEDS AND STOPS TO SETTLE THINGS MORE SECURELY IN PLACE, IN DOING SO DROPPING BALL
