Electing the President Three main plans of electing the President of the United States were considered by the Constitutional convention. One was for direct election by the people, one was for election by congress, and the third was for the electoral college. The second plan was tentatively adopted twice, on one occasion uanimously, but opinion gradually shifted in the favor of a balance of power between congress and the President and this could scarcely exist if the latter were chosen by the former. The electoral college plan was suggested by Hamilton and seems to have been borrowed from Maryland. It was assumed that the electors would be chosen from the most capable and trustworthy men and that these in turn would weigh the qualifications of persons available for the presidency and cast their ballots as free agents.

Mushrooms and Toadstools There is an ancient fallacy that a toadstool is a poisonous mushroom. All mushrooms that have an umbrella-like cap are roughly classed as toadstools. Another old rule was to eat the mushroom; if it caused death it was poisonous. Outdoor Indiana warns that it never is safe to collect mushrooms in the button stag because until they have opened it is not always possible to classify them. Other advice is: Never use specimens that are decomposed in the slightest degree. Neves use those in which insects have burrowed. Never use fungi with swollen bases surrounded by saclike or scaly envelopes. Never use fungi with milky juice unless the juice has a red color. Never use for food tube-bearing fungi in which the flesh changes color when
