ROGERS.—Mrs. H. G. Rogers died at her home in Nittany, Thursday at 9 p. m., following a stroke, which she suffered December 6. Her husband survives.

Mrs. Rogers, who was the former Anna May Crawford, was born at Richersburg, the daughter of John B. and Mary Crawford, November 10, 1867, making her age at the time of her death 69 years, 1 month, 7 days.

HERMAN.—Funeral services for Joseph Edward Herman, well-known resident of Mingo, who died at the Centre County hospital early Wednesday of last week, were held at the home of his son, Milford Herman, at Zion, Friday afternoon.

Mr. Herman was born in Missouri March 17, 1878, a son of William and Mary Herman and was 58 years, 8 months and 29 days old at the time of his death.

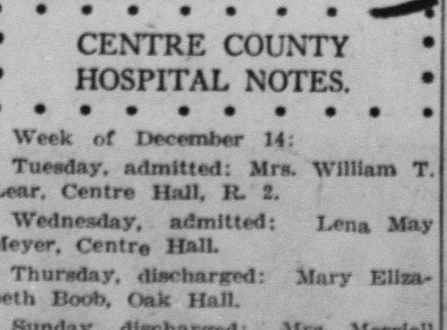
She was married to John Markley who was killed while working on the railroad in 1902 and later married Frank Huber, who was killed in the mines three years after their marriage.

BURNS.—Robert B. Burns, aged 58 years, prominent Muncy magistrate and former Lycoming county detective, died Wednesday morning of last week at his home, following a heart attack.

Robert Burns was born May 26, 1880, at Morrisville, Bucks county. His education was obtained in Trenton, N. J., to which place the Burns family moved.

Upon returning to Pennsylvania he located in Jersey Shore and Williamsport, where he served as a clerk in hotels. In 1913 he went to Muncy where he was clerk in the Commercial hotel. He subsequently became a member of the Muncy police force, served as chief of police, and in January of 1925 was appointed county detective of Lycoming county by District Attorney Henry C. Hicks.
