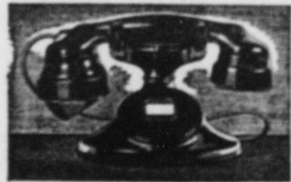

It is thought the woman had fallen in an attempt to take her life by hanging, since when taken from the cistern a rope tied first to a bed-post was tied around her neck. Passage to the cistern was through a window.

The woman was the wife of H. P. Leiby and was born in Mansfield 56 years ago. Her husband and a son, George, at home, and a daughter, Mrs. Carl Selleck, of Mansfield, survive.

Interment was made at Mansfield Wednesday forenoon.

September 30th is the final day for Pennsylvania farmers to apply for wheat insurance. Wheat producers in the State will have until that time to make application for wheat insurance policies which will assure them of having at least 50 or 75 percent of an average crop to sell in 1939.
