NEW LAW GOVERNS MERGING OF SCHOOLS

The merger law enacted by the recent General Assembly provides that with the advice of the county superintendent, county and local school boards may formulate plans of reorganization and the school boards of the local districts may make arrangements with respect to the distribution of assets and liabilities of the districts involved.

The plan thus prepared is to be submitted to the State Council of Education for its approval after which the question of merging may be submitted to the electorate for voting. This process requires the preparation of a petition by the county board of school directors which should indicate boundaries of districts to be merged, positions of existing and projected buildings, location of roads and railroads, type of school organization, number of teachers, schedule of lands, property, equipment, assessments, tax rates, etc.

The 1938 hunting license is designed to be more conspicuous than those of previous years. The licenses will have a red background with white numerals, whereas the non-resident licenses will have a green background with white numerals. The licenses are now in the hands of county treasurers and may be purchased.

FARM CALENDAR

Timely Reminders from The Penn'a State College School of Agriculture

Buy Rams Early—Livestock extension specialists with the Pennsylvania State College recommend the early purchase of rams to head the ewe flock.

Meeting the Feed Shortage—For farms on which feed supplies are short as a result of the drought, dairy extension specialists at Penn State suggest rigid culling to eliminate low producers.

Buying Fall Bulbs—Avoid buying cheap or bargain bulbs for planting this fall to provide early spring blooms, warn Penn State extension florists.

Reinforcing Apple Trees—Bracing heavily loaded apple trees will prevent their splitting or breaking under the heavy load, remind fruit specialists at Penn State.

Controlling Grasshoppers—Grasshoppers can be kept under control in heavily infested fields by spreading poison bait made by mixing 100 lbs. of bran, 2 quarts of 40 per cent liquid sodium arsenite, and 10 gallons of water, say Penn State extension entomologists.

Feeding Beef Cattle—The farmer who makes money on steers includes cattle feeding as part of his general farm operations and continues it year after year, some years making a profit, other years not obtaining market value for his feeds, but over a period realizing more than market price for the feed that he raises, livestock specialists at Penn State have found.

EIGHTY YEARS MAKES BIG DIFFERENCE IN PENN STATE CLASSES

Eighty years ago, at about this date, the five faculty members of the Pennsylvania State College were cheered by a "promising enrollment" of 119 students.

Even in utmost optimism, however, they would not have envisioned the recent announcement of Wm. S. Hoffman, present college registrar, that this year's freshman class alone will number 2,000.

Of the new students, granted admission, 1320 will be on the main campus at State College, 400 in the undergraduate centers at Pottsville, Hazleton, DuBois, Uniontown and Altoona, and 105 at the freshman forestry center at Mont Alto.

"The new class," said Mr. Hoffman, "will not only exceed last year's, which was the largest freshman class ever to matriculate in any Pennsylvania college, but it will also be the best prepared. Eighty-nine per cent of those who have paid their preliminary fees are from the upper two-fifths of their high school graduating classes."

The 125 freshman making up the quota for the main campus and Mont Alto were selected on a scholastic basis from more than 2800 applicants. They will arrive on the campus September 14 for the opening of Freshman Week.

The incoming class will raise to about 6,500 the number of candidates for the college's baccalaureate degrees. To accommodate this large student body, there are 60 major campus buildings with a net value of more than \$16,000,000.

More than 10,000 men were employed on the "Dream Highway" on August 29. The number will shortly be increased to 15,000. The additional men will be largely engaged in paving.
