On a piece of poorish soil, plowed the previous autumn, I sowed three bushels of Indian corn, broadcast, and harrowed it in. A small quantity of gypsum—about two and half bushels—and ten bushels of wood ashes (unbleached) were sowed on the piece, which contained one acre.

GOOSEBERRY, OR CURRANT AND RASPBERRY PUDDING.—Make a good crust, and line a pudding-basin, previously buttered, with it; pick your fruit and fill the basin; put in a very little water and some sugar, wet the edge of the paste all round, then cover the top with a crust and pinch the edges together.
