We clip the following from a communica- tion in the Homestead, as worth a few min- utes thought from the reading farmer: "In distributing manure, it is economical to give a liberal dressing as far as we go.— We must go through the labor of cultivation, and it costs no more to plant or hoe a field of corn or potatoes that will yield heavily, than one which will give poor returns; the only additional expense is the extra cost of harvesting." The same is true to the culture of any crop. "We are recommending to buy more stock for our farms as fast as we can find means for sustaining it; but what class of stock it is best to buy is less often discussed. In this too, it may be safely asserted that the proper course is to buy good stock. It costs no more to raise and keep good cattle than poor; and men who buy for the market always make a very great distinction between good and poor animals."
