yesterday's march, that Gen. Morris refused to let them pursue any further.

The results of the whole affair are the capture of the rebel camp at Laurel Hill, a large amount of tents and camp equipage, forty baggago wagons, a field camp chest, supposed to contain all their money, two regimental banners, one of them that of the Georgia regiment, from Georgia, captains and leathenants and a large number of Virginia officers, the death of Gen. Garnétt and twenty of his men, and a much larger number wounded.

Our loss is wholly in the 14th Ohio regiment, two being killed and two mortally wounded. Our forces are now engaged in burying the dead.

Gen. Gannett's body is lying at headquarters. It will be sent to his family at Richmond. All along the line of retreat the woods are filled with deserted rebels, and our men are ordered to stop arresting prisoners because we cannot take care of them.

There were over 4,000 rebels on the bluff commanding our position, who opened fire on the 14th Ohio, and the distance was little short of two hundred yards. Their artillery was rapidly served, but aimed about two feet too high, and cut off trees above the heads of our boys. Our advance, which alone entered into the engagement, numbering less than two hundred.

It is thought our forces at Rowlesburg will cut off the retreat of the remainder and secure the fow baggage wagons still left. The rebel army was composed mainly of Georgians and Eastern Virginians.

Col. Ramsey, of the Georgia regiment, succeeded Gen. Garnett in command. The Georgians were direct from Pensacola.

The same correspondent telegrapher from Grafton last night as follows:

"On coming through the field of battle of Cheat river yestorday with Maj. Gordon, who had charge of the corpse of Gen. Garnett, we found that the rebel army had left the remainder of their baggage train and artillery at a point two miles from St. George—Word was instantly sent back to Gen.
