THE OLD BELL AND THE NEW.—On last Wednesday, the old bell on our public school-house, which had rung its merry peals over this borough for sixty-three years, was taken down and replaced by a new one.

The old bell bears the following inscription: "Cast by Samuel Parker, Phila., 1798. William Smith, D. D., to the Borough of Huntingdon, Juniata." It was presented to this borough by William Smith, D. D., proprietor of the town, and was first placed upon the old Court House, which stood in Smith street, between Hill and Allegheny streets, at that time the only public building in the borough.
