They will receive the following sums as allowance, pay, premium, and boun To every recruit who is a veteran colunteer, as defined in General Orders of the War Department of June 25, 1863, No. 191, for recruitin greteran volunteers, one month's pay oruitin gveteran volunteers. one month's pay in advance, and a bounty and premium amounting to \$402. To all other recruits not veterans, accepted and enlisted as required in existing Orders, one months pay in advance, and in addition a bounty and premium amounting to \$302.
