

PR it regolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of the Representatives of the Commonwealth of the Representatives of the Commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof: e shall be an additional section to the third article Constitution, to be designated as section four, a ollows:

"Secrios 4. Whenover any of the qualified electors of the Commonwealth shall be in any actual military serice, under a requisition from the President of the United States, or by the authority of this Commonwealth, such electors may exorcise the right of suffrage in all elections by the citizens, under each regulations as are, or shall be prescribed by law, as fully as if they were present at their cash of a faller in a faction."

Section II. There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight, and nine, as follows.

"Sections 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills."

"Section 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature reanting any powers, or privileges, in any case, wherean the authority to grant such powers, or privileges, has been, or may hereafter be, conferred upon the courts of bis Commonwealth."
