FLAX. FLAX.

THE HIGH PRICES RULING FOR
Cotton Goods has compelled public attention to be in-
creased, and we have been directed to the culture of Flax. It can be made
with some attention, one of the most valuable products a
farmer can produce; an acre readily producing 60 to 80
bushels worth of fibre and seed. Great care should be
taken by growers here, where the Flax spread very thin
when rolling; when watered sufficiently on one side, it
should be turned, and subject to exposure until all the
stalks get a grey color, and the lint readily separates
from the wood by a gentle rub.

It should on a very dry day be tied in bundles, and is
then ready for the mill. As a general thing too much
seed is sown on an acre. Unless the ground is very rich
on DuBoull per acre is sufficient. If the ground is very
strong one and one fourth bushel is ample.
