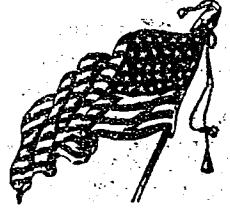

Reception of a Colored Regiment. The President Makes a Speech.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10.—The first District of Columbia colored regiment, which, in 1862, were hissed and hooted on their first parade in this city, received quite an ovation during their parade this morning, being enthusiastically applauded, not more by persons of their own color than by the large concourse of whites, on their way to the White House.

Upon their arrival at the White House, President Johnson appeared and addressed them in a speech of half an hour. He thanked them for the compliment paid him, and for the visit. He told them that the country for which they had so nobly fought, was as much their country as any body else's, and they should soon return as citizens to the walks of civil life.
